Johnson House 417 Columbus Ave. Sandusky, OH







Take your morning walk to the new Jackson Street Pier from this 1854 home, located just four blocks from the lake. Positioned between the Sandusky Library and the First Congregational Church, this property is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places and features approximately 3000 square feet of living space ready for someone who wants to design the interior footprint into a dream house. Recent improvements include a new roof, repaired soffits, fascia and corbels, a new 200-amp electrical service with meter and circuit breaker, a new basement sump pump and initial deconstruction of apartment unit kitchenettes and bathrooms. The property deed includes a dedicated parking space directly behind the rear entrance gate leading to the courtyard and back door.

Interior



The Johnson House is named after Leonard B. Johnson who lived in it for 28 years. He owned and named Johnson's Island where forty acres were used as a prison for Confederate Officers during the Civil War.

Living Room

The living room off the foyer includes a fireplace mantel that is in good shape. Double windows look out to the front porch.


