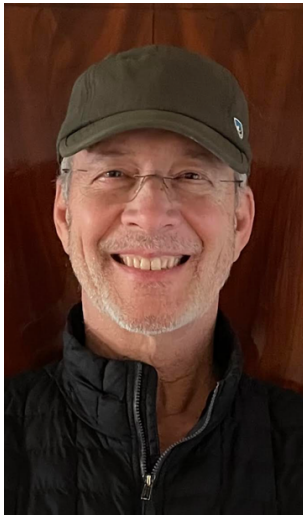
ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL TOUR OF HOMES

Hello all,

to pay online using your Credit Card. You can also pay your dues via our website using a check.

This is a new feature we recently added using Zeffy. It's like PayPal only, it's specifically created to support nonprofit organizations like the OHG. Zeffy doesn't charge us a fee for the transaction. Instead, they ask the purchaser to make a voluntary donation to them. We recommend (on the 2nd page) you change their default donation of 17% to 4%. On a \$25 Single Membership dues, it will add \$1.00. The donation is entirely voluntary. **If you don't wish to donate simply enter zero. A donation is not required.**

Dues should be paid by February 1st.

Dear Guild Members,

Thank you for your ongoing support of our work to preserve the beautiful and historic structures and artifacts in the Sandusky Community. Your Board of Trustees continues to seek opportunities to advance our mission as well as provide members with interesting and worthwhile events. During the past year we made the decision to recommit our energy and resources to projects and initiatives that specifically restore, preserve and repurpose properties throughout the city.

In April, we conducted our fourth installment of Do It Yourself Series (DIY) seminars with "Old House Though New Eyes," featuring Sam Ada, Manager of the Sandusky Sherwin Williams Paints. We celebrated our annual membership dinner in May at the Sandusky Yacht Club. Preservation awards were provided to six property owners in special recognition for their work in one of six categories established by our Preservation Committee. In June we held our second annual Garden Tour featuring seven unique and beautifully landscaped properties along with a chance to catch some horticultural tips at the City of Sandusky Greenhouse. In August we kicked back and invited members to a beautiful evening cruise on the Goodtime I. September brought us a unique opportunity to tour the former Waldock offices being transformed into apartments and venues by Tracey DeMore Hiss. We then moved to the Boeckling Club's biergarten to join in their Oktoberfest 2025 celebration.

And finally, we rounded out the year with our annual Candlelight Tour of Homes featuring six beautifully decorated residences long with a special viewing of the historic Masonic Temple. This year we added traveling carolers, a food wagon, a mystery game, and a new home base, the Boeckling Club that provided a wonderful venue to purchase tickets, win prizes and grab some food and drink. We also introduced online ticket sales for the first time, giving participants a simplified means of making their purchases.

December 2025 saw the return of our annual event, the Christmas Candlelight Tour of Homes. We feel we had a successful tour and from participants' comments, it was very well received and appreciated. In bringing back the tour, we made changes and additions to make this event more aligned to the twenty-first century. We focused on encouraging a younger generation of tour-goers, many with families, to participate. We put an emphasis on the use of technology which most people employ today.

Taking a cue from our membership and donation programs, we instituted the purchase of tickets online. By doing so, we were able to present our entire tour brochure, complete with details about the tour and the featured homes. Most importantly, tour-goers could use this technology for their map with Google gps directions popping up to maneuver from one featured home to another. This proved to be so much easier than trying to read a physical paper map in the dark that previously left the participant to figure out on their own how to navigate from one place to another. Actual pictures of each home were online to help identify and locate each home. Many tour-goers said they were able to spend less time traveling between homes and more time viewing each one.

There were adjustments which we had to make, like having a new home base since we no longer use the Cooke-Dorn House for that purpose. We selected the Boeckling Club this year which also afforded the tour-goer a chance to purchase a tasty treat and/or beverage while entering our traditional raffles of wreaths, 50/50 and free door prizes. There was also hot chocolate and donuts offered at one of our featured homes. And without saying, Santa and Mrs. Clause were at the Follett House Museum to greet young and old alike.

We introduced a mystery item hunt for the first time with clues given to help figure out the item and which home it was in. tour-goers submitted their answer via our website to enter the contest. This proved to be a fun addition to our tour involving an additional way to interact with tour participants using technology. This year's item was a vintage television located in the home of Nicholas and Lisa Pike on Milan Road, and was won by Hannah Schmid. Congratulations to her and hope she enjoys the \$50 gift certificate to Berardi's Family Kitchen. Congratulations also goes to all our other raffle winners. They are listed below.

2025 Candlelight Tour of Homes

The 2025 Candlelight Tour of Homes was another successful event. I heard many nice compliments about the food & drink trucks we had to the new online ticket ordering & check-in processes. Those were so nice to hear. It validates that all of the hard work put forth by the many volunteers across the community was well worth the efforts. Financially speaking, the OHG made \$6,834.20 in net profit for the tour. Although not as much as in previous years which may be explained by the colder weather or to the various community events that took place over the same weekend. I want to thank everyone who helped organize and participate in the event to make it the success that it was!

CD Investments

OHG maintains two CD investments with Civista Bank. Both have been growing nicely and have been renewed in recent weeks. During 2025 we made \$5,210.55 in interest income. Much better than sitting in a regular savings account. These funds are lying in wait for a project that the Board feels would be an appropriate use of these funds.

2025 Audit

The Bylaws of the Old House Guild call for an annual accounting of our revenues and expenditure. To comply with this requirement, I submitted the internal audit documenting all monthly receipts and expenditures, the resolutions from the minutes showing board approval of all financial transactions, and copies of December 2025 bank statements that verify ending balances from each of our accounts. A copy was provided to board members in early January. The board will discuss the report and I anticipate it will be approved at our March 2026 meeting. Copies of the audit are retained and are accessible to members for review upon request.

2025 Tax Return

The Old House Guild of Sandusky is a 501c3 organization and thus is exempt from taxes that would normally apply to a business. The IRS has made it easier for nonprofits to file taxes via what is called a Form 990N which allows us to send an electronic short form postcard verifying our continued existence as a nonprofit. This is anticipated to be filed as soon as the IRS makes the form available for the new year.

Zeffy/Credit Card Payments

We introduced the use of Zeffy to allow people to purchase Candlelight Tour of Homes tickets online. I was pleased with how easy it was to set up. We sold 244 tickets this way totaling \$4,567.00 which was a huge success for our first year. Zeffy is free for non-profit organizations to use, this allowed us to keep 100% of the income made from the ticket sales and purchasers also saved by not having to pay any credit card surcharges. For 2026 we will be extending our use of Zeffy by offering this as an option for members to pay their dues and for other events during the year.
